1. General Background

Good Neighbors International (GNI) has been working in Nepal since 2002 with the objective of improving the lives of people, especially children through implementing community development projects in the areas of education, child protection, income generation, public health, WASH, and disaster risk reduction. GNI Nepal upholds a child-centered community development model that puts the children at the center and works together with their families, communities and social institutions to achieve long-term development aspirations taking into account the multi-faceted nature of community development.

In 2022, GNI Nepal signed the fifth phase project agreement (PA, 2022-2026) with the Social Welfare Council (SWC) of Nepal to implement Integrated Community Development Project (ICDP) in 20 districts. This phase of the project is intended to improve well-being of children, their families and communities through implementing project's interventions in three sectoral areas: (a) Education and Protection, (b) Public Health, and (c) Social Economy.

Through this survey, GNI Nepal intends to generate contextual information from the project areas as baseline information. It is expected that the baseline information can be utilized for detailed planning and implementation of the project as per local context, and to assess the results through different monitoring and evaluation approaches in future.

2. Brief Information about the Project

Integrated Community Development Project (ICDP) of GNI Nepal is a child-centered development approach, which considers children as primary stakeholders. The organization strives to create a conducive environment for enabling children, their families and community members to have a better future and envisions self-reliant communities which allow children to thrive and have a dignified life. GNI Nepal's programming is based on United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), and the policies and plans of the Government of Nepal and it contributes towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) set out by the United Nations.

The thematic areas of project are education, child protection, public health, and social economy. Likewise, environmental management, Climate Change Adaptation and Disaster Risk Reduction (CCA & DRR) and gender are complementing to each thematic areas as cross cutting themes. The project's child protection, education, and public health interventions directly benefit children. Social economy and public health interventions benefit their families. Community members derive benefit from public health, community infrastructure, awareness-raising, advocacy, and CCA DRR interventions. The projects' interventions are driven by local needs, and its approach is largely a bottom-up process and strives to attain holistic development along with supporting children to grow with dignity.

3. Purpose and Rationale of Baseline Survey

GNI Nepal intends to conduct an independent survey to capture the baseline status for the project's results and indicators. GNI Nepal expects the baseline survey to capture the real context of project area which can support in planning project activities on the basis of an accurate understanding of the contemporary situation. Moreover, it is anticipated that the baseline findings can be utilized for updating the result framework, setting district level targets, and performing monitoring and evaluation in project to systematically assess project's results in periodic basis.

4. Objective of Baseline Survey

The overall objective of the baseline survey is to generate the primary data from the project's targeted communities. The baseline findings will be utilized to set the benchmark of a set of indicators outlined in the project results framework for systematic assessing the project's results in future.

5. Scope of Assignment

This baseline survey will be carried out in the project area (20 district) targeting children, their parents, and representatives of social institutions associated with the project. The primary data will be collected using quantitative and qualitative approaches of data collection, and the secondary information will be generated from available reports, records and document of associated social institutions.

The selected consultant has to perform the following scope of work for the baseline survey:

Note:

- (a) Quantitative data collection The data collection work will be carried out by a separate team using the KOBO toolbox.
- (b) Qualitative data collection The consultant team will conduct field work for qualitative data collection in 2 to 3 districts along with GNI team as a sample. During the field work, the consultant team should observe the quantitative data collection process as well. Later, staff of GNI Nepal and partner organization collect information/data from remaining districts following the similar techniques.

6. Survey Methodology and Approach

This baseline survey will apply a mixed-method approach, i.e., having both quantitative and qualitative methods. The quantitative method shall include household survey of targeted beneficiaries to generate the baseline data for the project's impact and outcome indicators. It is suggested to use structured (or semi-structured) questionnaires to collect quantitative information while other methods such as Focus Group Discussion (FGD) and Key Informant Interview (KII) can be applied for collecting qualitative data.

The information from associated social institutions (health post, schools and cooperatives) can be collected through in-depth or semi-structured interviews with representatives, observation of facilities, review of available documents and records, etc. Likewise, a specific checklist can be used to collect information from the associated social institutions.

Sampling and Sample size: It is suggested to apply the statistical methods/techniques that represent the survey participants from all categories of the project. The applicant for the assignment can suggest the appropriate sample size representing the entire target population of the project area. However, it will be finalized through consultation with GNI Nepal.

Survey participants: The nature of survey participants depend on the nature of information required for the survey. The quantitative data will be collected from household level where the household head, their families, children, adolescents can be considered as primary respondent. Likewise, data will be generated from other participants as well based on nature of project's results and indicators. Some of the expected participants are representatives of cooperative, schools and health facilities, Female Community Health Volunteers (FCHVs), Health Mother's Group (HMG), elected representatives and officials of Local Government Units, and other concerned stakeholders available at district and municipality level.

The selected consultant/firm may propose innovative methods of data collection, management and analysis based on the nature of the proposed survey. A joint meeting with the selected consultant/firm will be organized to set mutual understanding (as well as to finalize) on the best methodologies and approaches that can be applied to the survey.

8. Responsibilities of Good Neighbors International Nepal

Good Neighbors International Nepal will be responsible for the information dissemination to project offices and partners including coordination and collaboration required at field level for the survey. Specifically, GNI Nepal will:

- Provide inputs to finalize the detailed survey plan, methodologies, tools, approaches, and instruments
- Manage logistics for orientation to GNI staff on survey methodology and data collection process.
- Assign the research assistant and enumerators for data collection work
- Give inputs on the draft report and facilitate to finalize the report
- Bear all direct costs of the consultant as per agreement

9. Budget and Payment Procedures

The individual consultant/firm shall propose a **total budget** (including tax) with a detailed breakdown including applicable taxes at the time of proposal submission. The budget covers consultancy fees of thematic experts and other direct costs related to the scope of work.

The consultant/firm shall bear all tariffs, duties, and applicable taxes or charges levied at any stage during the execution of the work.

The total consultancy cost (agreed) will be paid in three installments:

- 30% upon submission and acceptance of the inception report
- 40% upon submission of the draft report including sharing the survey findings in an internal meeting and acceptance of the draft report
- 30% upon acceptance of the final report

10. Proposed Team Composition

GNI Nepal expects a survey team composition of experts with proven experience in the field of development survey and research, especially in community development. The proposed team composition should be as follows:

[A] Survey Team Leader: The team leader shall be responsible for ensuring the survey is correctly designed, implemented and reported.

The team Leader shall have at least a Master's Degree in social science or related fields (PhD preferable) and at least 5 years of professional experience in:

- o Planning, designing and management of qualitative and quantitative studies
- Developing a wide variety of data collection tools
- Expertise in high volume data collection, management, and analysis
- Training and managing survey team
- Hands-on experience in excellent professional report writing of surveys/research in advanced
 English language

[B] Data Analyst: Data analyst should have;

- At least a Master's Degree in statistics and/or survey database management
- At least three years of relevant experience in quantitative research, including baseline/endline of development projects

- Advanced knowledge of research software (both quantitative and qualitative) for data management and analysis
- Excellent analytical skills

[C] Thematic experts: thematic experts (if required) related to nature of project theme (a) education and child protection, (b) public health, (b) social economy

11. Termination of the Contract

GNI Nepal will terminate the contract if the consultant/firm commits a breach in the performance or observance of its obligation under this ToR. The consultant/firm shall be notified in written form within a week prior to the termination of the agreement.

12. Confidentiality

During the performance of the assignment or any time after the expiry or termination of the agreement, the consultant/firm shall not disclose to any person or otherwise make use of any confidential information which the consultant/firm has obtained or may obtain in the course of the survey relating to partner organization/GNI, the respondents or otherwise.

13. Copyright

The consultant/firm shall collect and document required information during the entire course of the survey and include information/data that are not included in the report under annexes. The consultant/firm shall also take relevant pictures. Copyright of all of the data and documents will remain with GNI Nepal. The consultant/firm cannot publish the findings of this study without taking prior consent from GNI Nepal.

15. Evaluation Criteria of the Call for Proposal

Quality and cost-based selection criteria would be adopted to select the consultant/firm. 70% weightage

is given to the technical proposal that includes the proposed methodology, approach of determining

the survey population and sampling, approaches of data collection, team composition, the experience

of the survey team, and quality control on analysis and reporting. The 30% weightage is provided to

financial bidding, i.e., the proposed cost for the survey.
